Motion by Buse; seconded by Hays to approve the 2006-07 student/parent handbook as presented. Motion carried (5-0).

Motion by Clausen; seconded by Buse to offer a contract to Linda Chada to serve as substitute bus driver. Motion carried (5 - 0).

Motion by Buse; seconded by Rebhuhn to approve a bid with Interstate Brands for bread and Anderson Erickson for milk for the 2006-07 school nutrition program. Motion carried (5 - 0).

Motion by Hays; seconded by Rebhuhn to allow the City of Truesdale to use the former AC-T school property for urban development instead of recreation as stipulated in the sale agreement. Motion

carried (5 - 0).

Motion by Hays; seconded by Clausen to recommend the following as the five legislative priorities of the Albert City-Truesdale CSD: 1) Supports extending the school infrastructure local option tax to a statewide penny sales tax distributed on a per pupil basis, recalculated annually to adjust the statewide average revenues per student; 2) Supports setting allowable growth at a rate that encourages continuous school improvement and reflects actual cost increases experienced by school districts. The allowable growth rate should be set no lower than 6 percent; 3) Supports a

budget guarantee for school districts with declining enrollment and real on-time funding for districts with increasing enrollment in the current year; 4) Supports funding to ensure that all three and four year olds have access to a high quality public school preschool program to be funded by revenues that do not divert what would otherwise be K-12 resources. Funding should be allocated for literacy-based programs with well-articulated standards of high quality; 5) Supports funding to lengthen the school year for the purpose of improving student achievement. The

district should retain the authority to locally determine the most appropriate use of additional time for professional development or student contact. Motion carried (5 - 0).

Motion by Buse; seconded by Hays to appoint Deb Clausen as the Legislative Action Network Member for the 2006-07 school year. Motion carried (5 - 0).

Motion by Clausen; seconded by Hays to participate with area schools in the study of a regional high and appoint Brent Moens and Shelly Buse to represent AC-T. Motion carried (5 - 0). At this time this is a only a study being conducted.

The board discussed a request from Storm Lake Schools to call for a vote to extend the Local Option Sales Tax to change the ending date from 2014 to 2022. This will be further discussion topic at a future meeting.

The Principal and Superintendent gave brief reports relating to upcoming events within the school.

The Superintendent presented to the board a check from the Willie Wilbur family as a memorial to the many years of service he dedicated to the school. The money will be used in combination with other memorial funds to repair the school sign at the front entrance to the school. The board would like to thank the Wilbur family for their generous donation in Willie's name.

The district also received a donation from Pleasant View Homes for use of freezer space and filing cabinets. The board thanks them for their donation as well.
