School Calendar

On December 12th, a memo was released from Director Brad Buck from the Iowa Department of Education. The memo stated that waivers for an Early Start Date for school calendars would no longer be automatically approved and that districts would have to show a negative impact on education in order to receive permission to start school earlier than the week of September 1st. I hear may people ask "why do you start so soon", and many times they don't understand all of the systemic issues involved in this decision. But if the law is enforced and no waivers are allowed, many people will understand why we apply for a waiver.

This is not a new law, in fact, the rules on school start date has been on the books for several years. Schools have been allowed to ask for a waiver for an earlier start and the waivers were always granted. All but two school districts in the state requested a waiver this last year. Under pressure from the state's fair board and tourism board, the Governor mandated Director Buck to begin to enforce the law.

The other question I have about this rule is that it is not consistent with the state athletic association rules. An August 31st start date means that we will be playing our first football and volleyball games before school even starts. Despite the Athletic Unions not being under the umbrella of the Iowa Department of Education, shouldn't all activities involving students have to follow the same guidelines?

Obviously, the later we start, the further into June we would go. Again, a conflict would involve the start of baseball and softball, that would be playing 4-5 nights a week and also many times play in all day Saturday tournaments. I don't see this being beneficial to students who have that schedule while trying to complete finals. At Newell-Fonda we encourage as many activities as possible for kids. If we are unable to start school on time, we will see kids not participating in Fall sports in order to keep working, and Spring and Summer sports may also take a hit because of the busy schedule of classes and games.

I hope this issue will be debated in this upcoming legislative session and rather than Governor Branstad mandating the issue, that we continue to have the flexibility to start school based on a local choice, with student priorities coming first.



STATE OF IOWA

Dear Iowa parents,

Reading is essential to your children's success in school and in life. In Iowa, we are working to make sure all children read well by the end of third grade, which is the pivotal time when students go from learning to read to reading to learn.

Research shows that children's third-grade reading skills can predict their future success, and proficient readers are more likely to graduate from high school and earn a good living. However, nearly 1 in 4 Iowa third graders did not meet reading expectations last year, according to state test results. We must help our students improve their reading skills.

That's why identifying struggling students starting in kindergarten and providing intensive intervention form the centerpiece of a 2012 state law to improve literacy. Iowa's new early warning system for literacy is helping schools across the state screen students, monitor their progress, and provide reading interventions in preschool through third grade.

Making sure parents or guardians are notified when their children need help and providing resources that families can use at home also are part of Iowa's 2012 law. I want to be sure you are aware of a state website where you can find those resources: https://iowacore.gov/parents-community

This website includes a link to great materials provided by the Iowa Reading Research Center that will help you understand and work with your child on specific literacy skills. You can easily find activities based on your child's grade level or reading skill on the center's Family Resources page: http://www.iowareadingresearch.org/literacy-resources/teacher-family-resources/

It is critical for us to work together early – especially in kindergarten, first and second grades – to make sure students develop the skills they need to succeed in reading. Starting in May 2017, children who are identified as

substantially deficient in reading by the end of third grade must attend a summer reading program, or they will be retained in third grade unless they qualify for an exception. Prevention, not retention, is what everyone wants.


Giving Iowa students a world-class education is critical in today's knowledge-based economy, but that's not possible unless they can read. I look forward to working with you on this historic effort to help Iowa children read by the end of third grade. Thank you for helping us to meet this goal.

It's been a fabulous winter in the nurse's office!

- ~This was the third year that Brenda Thams, RN assisted me with our December screenings. She took heights and weights on students, then figured BMI's (body mass index), while I completed a vision screen. These results are sent home with report cards this month. AEA was here the same day to complete hearing tests on select grades and all new students.
- ~I continue to spend time in the 1st-through-6th grade classrooms every week during fluoride. We've talked about portion sizes, how to prevent getting lice, what fluoride is and where it comes from, and the effects of caffeine. I even brought in wisdom teeth so our students could see how big the roots are on permanent teeth!
- ~I will be teaching the Kindergarten class about teeth in February for Dental Health Month. We learn about the different parts of a tooth, and practice brushing and flossing on hard-boiled eggs and egg cartons! I am also available to help in classrooms on other health-related topics, or to reinforce teaching in health units.
- ~In an effort to increase the oral health of Iowans, all Kindergarten students are required to have a dental screen. I have been compiling those to report and completing screens on children who need one.
- ~While there are always illnesses circulating among us, this time of year tends to be worse. Make sure you get plenty of rest, stay well-hydrated, and most importantly, wash your hands frequently. The best way to stay healthy is not to let those bugs enter your body in the first place, so make an effort not to touch your face, eyes, nose or mouth unless you've just cleaned your hands.


