Dear Kindergarten Parents:

Welcome to Kindergarten! I look forward

to having your child in Kindergarten. I take pride in being a teacher and believe in helping and encouraging students to be



the best that they can be. I am dedicated to help and teach every child in many different ways to engage each learner, as well as, lifelong skills that they will use in their everyday lives. I will work closely with you to best benefit your child's education. I believe that communication is extremely important to have between parents and teachers to assist students to achieve their goals. During the school year please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions, comments or concerns.

About Mrs. Frederick: I have a passion for teaching. I have always wanted to become a teacher ever since I was in Kindergarten! Finally my dream career came true! I graduated from BVU in 2010 with a major in Elementary Education. I started my career as a One-on-One Para Educator/Associate and a Spelling and Reading Teacher for two years, prior to teaching Kindergarten. This will be my 8th year at the Albert-City Truesdale Elementary School. My husband Josh and I live in a beautiful home in Marathon. We have two children; Angel, our daughter, who will be 11 in October and Joshua Jr., our son, will turn 7 in May. We keep very busy at home with our two beautiful blessings.

Parent and Teacher Relationship: As a teacher, I believe that it is important to have a good parent and teacher relationship. This will also help to maximize the success of your child. During the school year, I will communicate with you through a monthly newsletter, notes, conversations, telephone calls if needed, emails and conferences. If there is ever a time that you have a question, comment or concern feel free to contact me at the school at 712-843-5416 ext. 235 or on my cell phone 712-749-9435. Communication is key for a successful school year. I will do my best to keep you informed of important information throughout the year.

Take Home Folder/Communication Log: Your child will be bringing home a folder that will contain notes, newsletters, school work, etc. every day. It is important that you check your child's folder and book bag each night and send it back to

school the next day. I will send their folder home each night even if they do not have mail. I do this to keep our routine and to stay consistent; that way you're not searching for a folder that is at school. The folder will also serve as their communication log. Inside of the folder there is paper that we will use to communicate about your child. Please check this part of your child's folder at night as well. If your child has a change in their after school transportation plan, please contact the school or write a note so that I can ensure they get to the correct place.

Health: Please remember that if your child has a fever or has vomited, they may not return to school until they are symptom free for 24 hours. If your child is at school and not feeling well you may be contacted to come and pick them up if they are not able to be comfortable at school.

First Week of School: During the first week of school we will be learning about one another and getting familiar with the fast paced Kindergarten classroom. We will talk about school and classroom expectations, as well as, get settled into our classroom. I will not only take pictures of your child on the first day/week of school but also throughout the school year as they learn with many fun activities and experiences. There will be a form to fill out at registration to get your permission to use these photos to share what we are learning!

"Monster of the Week": Each week there will be "Monster of the Week," who will tell the class about themselves. They will get to color and fill out a large poster that will be displayed for their special week. The "Monster" may bring in 3-5 pictures to share with the class if they wish. Their picture will be displayed in our classroom as well as the hallway for positive recognition.

Mystery Bag: The Mystery Bag takes the place of "show and tell" in our classroom. Mystery Bag is a fun way for students to share their interests from home with their friends at school. I have enclosed a letter regarding the Mystery Bag in this packet for further details. The Mystery Bag is a fun way to learn about asking questions, thinking about the item using three clues, and engaging in a discussion about the item. The kiddos love this!!

Reading: In Kindergarten, your child will learn how to read! We work with the alphabet and letter sounds all year to help with reading and with writing. They will enjoy many fun activities when learning how to read. You are probably used to reading books to your children, but after they learn how to read, they will want to read to you. © I love listening to them read. It is awesome to see the growth that they will make in Kindergarten. We currently use the Journeys curriculum and it is a great resource and program to teach children many different reading skills as well as Science and Social Studies. Journeys has many fun learning materials, as well as, Alpha friends. Alpha friends are letter card people or animals who represent each letter of the alphabet. The kids enjoy dancing to each Alpha friend's song. © Also a fun practicing tool that the kids have enjoyed is the flashcards to practice their words. I will send a copy of these flashcards home each week when we have a new list of words. They will also have the same set at school so that it is routine. We also use the Next Steps to Guided Reading for small groups. This allows the kids to learn at their level and move up when needed.

Center Time: The centers in our classroom include Math, Science, Writing, Art, Blocks, Reading, Legos, STEM, Home Living and Doll House. I will change centers throughout the year. Centers are a fun way for children to learn by exploring and playing. The amount of center time will change throughout the year.

Math: Your child will learn many things about Math in Kindergarten. In addition to Math, they will also enjoy Counting Collections, which helps children get to understand the numbers as well as learning how to count, identify, add, subtract or take away, and much more. Math is a fun time that I like to do a lot of hand on activities to help them touch and feel to learn about Math.

Science, Social Studies, Writing and Health: Science, Social Studies, Writing and Health will be integrated with Reading and other subjects. There are many fun lessons that we do to learn about these subjects.

PJ Day: I like to reward kids for working hard and doing their work. PJ Day is a fun way to get kids excited about the work they have accomplished. To earn this reward they have to work as a team to earn marbles to fill a jar. When the jar is filled, they get a PJ Day. ©

Transportation: It is important that I am aware of your child's after school transportation plan, so that I can get them to the right place. I like to know the after school plans for my students to ensure that they are safe. I would like you to please fill out the enclosed Transportation form so that your child and I understand how they are getting home after school. Please return the form to me on the first day of school or sooner if you would like. Also if there is ever a change in their after school transportation, please leave a note for me in your child's folder, or call the school. These changes are very important for the safety of the students. Thank you!

Clothing: In Kindergarten we will be learning through activities with painting, going outdoors and messy projects at times. Please feel free to allow your child to wear clothes that they can get messy in! During winter months, all students will need to bring snow pants, boots, hats and mittens for recess. Also I do ask that you please bring a pair of extra clothes for your child at school, as we sometimes need to change our clothes after projects, going outside or getting wet from the snow in the winter. I do have extra clothes that I have organized, with different clothing items that students can borrow if they need to; however, if your child comes home with clothes on that belong to the school, please wash them and return them to Kindergarten. Thank you! ©

Birthdays: Birthdays in Kindergarten are so much fun! When your child celebrates his/her birthday they may bring treats for the class if you choose. A number count for treats and classroom allergies will be provided at the beginning of the school year. If your child has a summer birthday we celebrate it on a day of your choosing or in May before school is out. Each student will get to pick a gift from the birthday box, wear a birthday crown and sticker too!

Lunch: Your child may choose to eat school lunch or bring a sack lunch from home. If you choose to send a sack lunch please make sure that there is an ice pack to keep their food cold.

Classroom: I enjoy making the classroom a fun and exciting place. I change my theme each year to have a new and engaging place for kids to learn. For the 2019-2020 school year our classroom theme is going to be Cute and Friendly Monsters. I will decorate exciting areas in our classroom and many fun things for the kids to see throughout the classroom. I will incorporate fun ways to engage children within this theme and also many learning activities. I know the kids are super excited for a Monster theme this year!

I look forward to teaching your child in Kindergarten and working with you, to make your child successful, together. \odot

Some have not yet grasped subtraction, but we are getting there! Please continue to support your child's Math brain!




We hope that your family is enjoying our school wide book, "The Mouse and the Motorcycle."




Dear Kindergarten Families:

In our Kinder classroom, your child will be participating in something I call, The Mystery Bag. The Mystery Bag takes place of show and tell. The kiddos love this part of the day!
