Update from Mrs. Annette Benedict, K-6 Resource Teacher

As the second semester of school gets underway, make it a priority to include your child in real life opportunities that encourage deeper thinking and sharpen academic skills. Even simple activities, such as letting your child help with the cooking by reading the recipe and measuring ingredients, are beneficial in teaching your child important skills and concepts. Look for opportunities to encourage reading and mathematical thinking skills [using addition, subtraction, estimation, measurement, etc.] through the activities you are already planning. Some examples include: calculating cost on a shopping trip, measuring items around the house, and tracking/charting the weather daily. It's also important for your child to read every day! It doesn't matter what the material is—magazines, books, road signs, instructions for a new game, cereal boxes-- just read!!



Also, if your child has access to a computer, take advantage of the free online sites designed to help your student practice essential skills. Most of the sites have fun activity ideas and interactive games to engage your child in learning. AC-T School Adopts New Library Automation Program by Mrs. Paulette McCall, Librarian
Students at Albert City-Truesdale Elementary School will soon be checking books out electronically and will have the capability of searching the school library catalog via the web with the installation of a new library management product and tool. Follett Software's web-based Destiny platform is the leading library and textbook automation product for the K-12 marketplace in North America. With Destiny, students, staff, teachers, and parents will have expanded access to library resources from school or home. Searching the library catalog can be done anytime, 24 hours a day, 7 seven days a week, and research may be conducted in the classroom or library, at school or home or any location where one has a computer and internet access. Students using the new library automation program will develop 21st century learning and technology skills.


The library automation project was partially funded by the Buena Vista County Foundation with a grant that was awarded to the Albert City-Truesdale School Library.

Reading: It's not just a class; it's an adventure! And it should be! By Mrs. Christina Balder, Title 1
Winter testing was finished in December. Students are placed into reading groups based on test scores and teacher recommendations. Students experience many different types of reading strategies to help them understand the text they are reading. Teachers also show students that there are many different ways to learn and enjoy books by using these strategies.

Students also have the privilege of learning reading through a computer reading program called "Reading Plus". AC-T received a grant to implement this program in our school. Reading Plus helps students transition from phonics and oral instruction to independent silent reading. Students will become better silent readers and independent learners. Reading Plus provides practice in word recognition, vocabulary, fluency, and a variety of forms of comprehension. It covers all the major components of reading instruction. After using Reading Plus, students in grades 3-6 will show substantial gains in fluency and silent reading, comprehension, vocabulary, and overall reading proficiency.

So, if your child, it doesn't matter the age, ever says, "I don't have anything to do", say to them, "Let's read a book together and go on an adventure."
