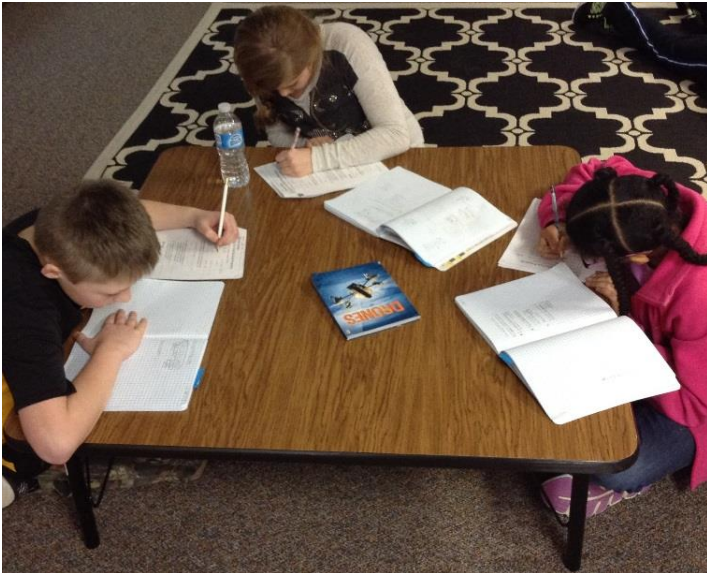
Open Enrollment Deadline of March 1st

Parents and guardians considering the use of open enrollment in the state of Iowa should be aware of the following dates: **March 1, 2017** - Last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2017-2018 school year. If the student meets the definition of good cause under the Iowa Administrative Code, or is an entering kindergarten student for the 2017-2018 school year, the application can be accepted after March 1, 2017. **Kindergarten ONLY - Deadline is Sept. 1, 2017.** If you need forms or additional information, please contact Principal Sarah Voyles.

5TH GRADE NEWS BY MRS. AMY STEPEC

In 5th grade, we have implemented a Flexible Seating Pilot Program. We have a variety of seats for students to sit at throughout the day. Students are free to choose where they sit. Research shows that students need to move around ... Brain research also confirms that physical activity – moving, stretching, and walking – can actually enhance the learning process. Eric Jensen (2000), in his article *Moving with the Brain in Mind*, protests against the sedentary classroom style and suggests a better way to spend the long days in our classrooms, not only for students, but for teachers. Teachers need to engage students in a greater variety of postures, including walking, lying down, moving, learning against a wall or desk, perching, or even squatting. The brain learns best and retains most when the organism is actively involved in physical activity.... Reynolds (Science of fitness, 2015) says that “Globally speaking, kids sit on average 8.5 hours. Movement and activity really drops after age 8. That’s of course, when school, homework and tech devices take over kids’ lives.”
