It's amazing to me how fast time flies when you work with children. I guess the saying, "Time flies when you're having fun" really rings true in a school. We are now in the fourth quarter. For me this is a great time to reflect on all of the great things that have been going on at AC-T.

Our Iowa Assessment scores are back and I am pleased with the results. I have included a breakdown of how each of our grades did on the different subjects. With our small class sizes it only takes one or two students to bring down the average, but it's important to not only look at the class as a whole, but the growth our students are making. Our teachers have been using this information as well as other assessment data throughout the year to guide their instruction. It's hard not to spend a great deal of time focusing on Iowa Assessment data because it is used so widely by the state, however we strive at AC-T to create well-rounded individuals and sometimes that doesn't always show up on a standardized test. Since our students in 2<sup>nd</sup> – 6<sup>th</sup> grade worked so hard on their assessments they will get to spend a day at the Wellness Center in Emmetsburg yet this spring.

Under the guidance of Mrs. Sievers, three 6<sup>th</sup> grade students competed at our local History Day in Storm Lake. From that competition they earned the opportunity to present their project at State History Day on April 25<sup>th</sup> in Des Moines. Congratulations to Toby Kruse, Isaac Albeus and Sara Feeley on this honor!

Leah Bean was recognized this spring for her conservation poster that she submitted last year. Her poster was chosen to go from the state competition on to the national competition in Utah. She earned a National Honorable Mention for her work. We are very proud of all of her hard work. Thank you to Mrs. Bean for encouraging our students to learn not only about art principles, but also about soil conservation practices through the poster contest.



This spring we kicked off a Watch DOGS (Dads of Great Students) program. Watch DOGS is a national program that is designed to encourage positive male role models in the school. Our Watch DOGS kick – off was a success with 30 father-figures and 44 students joining us for a

night of fun and pizza. It is great to have so many people involved in our students' lives and this is just another example of our community's willingness to take an active role in a child's life. After the kick-off night we had 14 dads sign up to come in and volunteer a day out of their busy schedules at school. Thank you to the father-figures for taking the time to be involved in our school!



The students were given a challenge during the month of March to bring in as many pop tabs as they could in support of the Ronald McDonald House. I challenged the students in hopes that they would be able to help those in need and they far exceeded my expectations. Our students were able to bring in about 380 pounds of pop tabs! Please continue to send pop tabs to school as our 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the tabs with them on their field trip to Des Moines and deliver them to the Ronald McDonald House there.

# Update from Rob Olsen, Superintendent

Spring has sprung and we are looking forward to an awesome finish to a great school year! I have included a couple of items the School Board has been working on the past couple months.

## **Albert City Athletic Fields and Open Space**

We are looking for ideas of how to best use the fields and open space available. An Advisory Council has been created made up of members from the School board, City Council and Albert City Chamber so we can begin to take some of the ideas and work together to find a viable use for the fields and buildings. If you have any ideas to pass along, please contact myself or a member of the School Board.

## **Summer Work**

The School Board has approved the removal of the ceiling on the east side of the building, which contains asbestos. Site Services, Inc. is contracted to complete the work this summer. Once the ceiling has been removed, a new ceiling will be installed with new energy efficient lighting, which will save utility dollars in our general fund. As part of this project, we are also looking into replacing the flooring in these rooms since the rooms will be empty from the abatement work. Phase 2 of this project will occur next summer with the removal of the ceiling on the west side of the building.

Nurse  Notes

~I am continuing to spend a few minutes in each classroom every Thursday, teaching a small lesson on good health every week. Recently, we've talked about seat belt use and proper positioning, prevention and

treatment of blisters, good hygiene, and how much sugar is in pop. For instance, if you drink 6 16.9-oz. bottles of pop, the amount of sugar in all of those is nearly 2 cups!  
~Ideally, every child should see their doctor, dentist and eye doctor every year. What better time than during summer break? Call now and make all of those appointments for early summer. June, July and August fly by, and it's a relief to get all of those taken care of before the back-to-school rush!

~Immunizations: Students going into 7<sup>th</sup> grade will need a tetanus booster, required before they start school. Pre-K and Kindergarten students are also required to have certain vaccines before beginning the new school year. I will be looking at our current students this spring and letting those going into Kindergarten know what they need in the way of immunizations.

~May 2-8 is Screen-Free Week: Have you ever taken a "vacation" from your TV or other devices? Even a majority of infants and toddlers are spending as much as 2 hours per day in front of TV or videos; older elementary students can spend more than 7 hours per day of screen time! Research shows that children who spend less or no time in front of a screen tend to eat better, sleep better, are more physically active, perform better in school, and play more creatively. Spring is a great time to take a break from screens and spend time outside together as a family. You can also make small changes to your routine: turn the TV off during meals and first thing in the morning, and encourage your children in sensory play, like containers in water at the kitchen sink. Hours of fun!

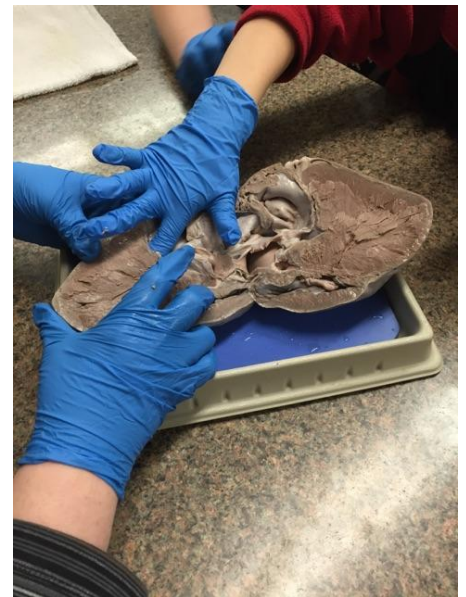

Awards ceremony will be held at 8:30 am.



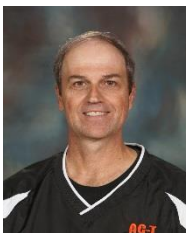

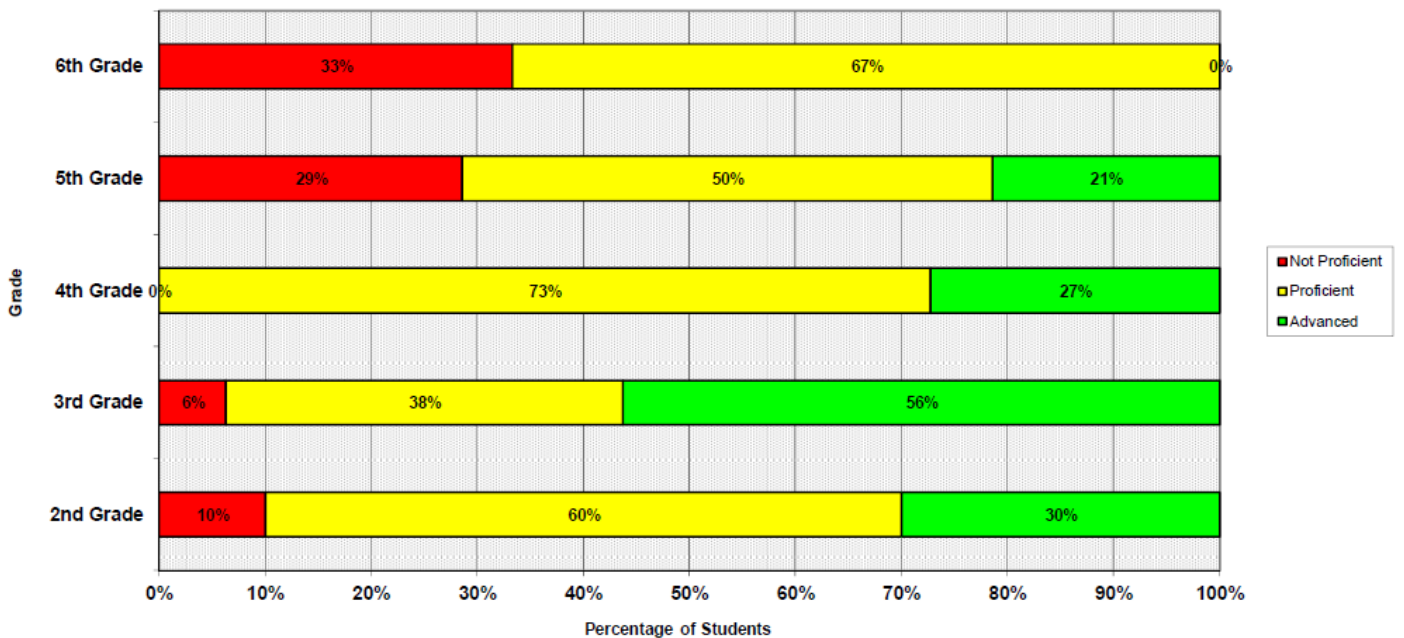
# Iowa Assessment Results Grades 2<sup>nd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> for 2015-2016

Social Studies by Grade



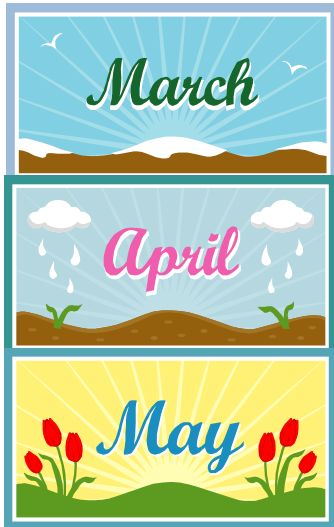
